

## MITRED THROW

This pattern has been kindly supplied by the **Wondoflex Yarn Craft Centre** for use by our kogo volunteer knitters. It is a quite simple but very effective blanket pattern which results in no actual sewing together of squares which, of course, is very, very appealing!!

### You Will Need:

- 6.50mm knitting needles
- 5.00mm crochet hook
- 11 balls of Cleckheaton California

### Measurements:

- Approx. 130cm x 150cm

### Abbreviations

**K2 tog** – Knit 2 stitches together, **psso** – pass slipped stitch over, **dc** – double crochet, **ch** - chain

### Instructions

Cast on 39 stitches

1<sup>st</sup> row: (Wrong side) knit

NR: (Right side)

Knit 18, slip 1, k2 tog, psso, knit 18

NR: knit

NR: knit 17, slip 1, k2tog, psso, knit 17

NR: knit

NR: knit 16, slip 1, k2tog, psso, knit 16

NR: knit

Continue to decrease in this manner until 1 stitch is left.

Leaving 1<sup>st</sup> stitch on needle and with right side facing, pick up and knit 19 stitches evenly along top of square, turn and cast on 19 stitches ... 39 stitches.

Repeat from 1<sup>st</sup> row until 7 squares have been completed. Break yarn and finish off.

### 1<sup>st</sup> square of 2<sup>nd</sup> Row:

Cast on 20 stitches, then with Right Side facing and beginning at the bottom edge, pick up 19 stitches along the right-hand side of the 1<sup>st</sup> square ... 39 sts.

Continue as before from 1<sup>st</sup> row (wrong side).



### 2<sup>nd</sup> and other squares of 2<sup>nd</sup> Row:

Pick up 19 sts along the top of square just finished, then 19 sts along the right-hand edge of 2<sup>nd</sup> square in 1<sup>st</sup> row ... 39 sts. Complete as for other squares. Keep adding squares onto squares until you have 9 squares in length and 8 squares in width.

### Crochet Edging

#### Round 1:

Join yarn to just past a corner and work a round of dc evenly around blanket, working 3dc into each corner. After last corner has been worked, join with a sl st to first dc.

#### Round 2:

Ch1, then 1dc into every dc until the 2<sup>nd</sup> dc of the 3dc's worked into the corner is reached. Work 3dc into this dc. Continue working 1dc into each dc, with 3dc's being worked into the 2<sup>nd</sup> dc of the group of 3dc's worked in each corner. Join with a slip stitch to complete the round.

### To Complete

Darn in ends and block work by pinning blanket out to an even, rectangle shape, covering with a damp cloth, and allowing to dry.
